Seminar on "Religious Diversity and Interfaith Harmony,"









Faisalabad (October 24, 2024): Government College Women University Faisalabad (GCWUF) hosted a seminar on "Religious Diversity and Interfaith Harmony," chaired by Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Zill-I-Huma Nazli, with Dr. Tanveer Qasim, Director Coordination at Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC), as the chief guest and the guest speaker. The Directorate of Student Affairs organized the event with the Departments of Islamic Studies, Botany, and Statistics. In her address, Vice Chancellor Dr. Zill-I-Huma Nazli emphasized that tolerance is the best solution for eradicating religious discrimination, highlighting that Islam teaches respect for religious minorities. She added that providing space and rights to non-Muslims is a hallmark of an Islamic society. Dr. Nazli also stressed the need to foster an environment of moderation and tolerance in society, appreciating the Punjab government's initiatives for youth and the PHEC's efforts to promote interfaith harmony.
